### our purpose

For years MGH has partnered with IWU to conduct a community health needs assessment. The findings indicated that chronic diseases are a strong concern among our residents. Of the chronic diseases, diabetes emerged as a root contributor for many other chronic health issues. MGH and a number of community organizations have focused on improving disease management and awareness. This has empowered those who are diagnosed with diabetes to be able to lead a much healthier life.

Another area identified by the Community Health Profile provided a consensus from the community that the prominent areas of health care concerns were lung disease, diabetes, unhealthy weight, and late diagnoses of diseases. Additional measures have been developed and implemented to address these issues of concern.


